Identify the dreams, challenges and opportunities related to regeneration, forming a network of collaboration among people. ●

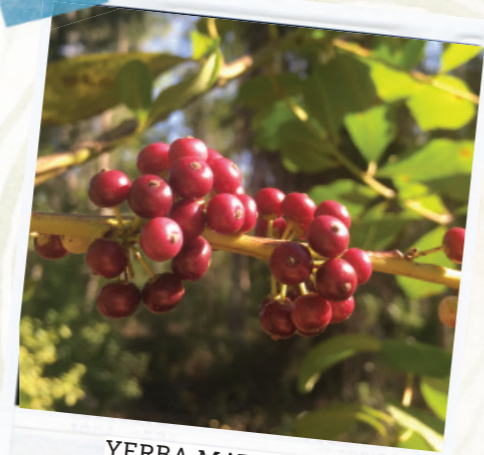
Take nourishment from sharing lived experiences, knowledge and different perspectives on different issues. ● ●

Our actions

We hold meetings in our Life Regeneration Center (Cerevi) inside the reserve on the Andresito Peninsula among people from diverse disciplines and contexts. We encourage conversations about regeneration that have potential for positive socio-environmental impact through concrete actions.

During these encounters, we explore the jungle and the Iguazú River along trails and participate in the daily activities in the reserve, getting to know the people who work every day in FAI territory.



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Our edge

Power of place

The rainforest is a stage that calls on participants to play their part in this live immersion experience. The spiraling walkways through the Cerevi, the observation of the ecosystem strata and inhabiting the forest are the common thread that guides these conversations.



Interdependence and diversity

Biodiversity is what supports life on Earth; all species give and receive essential contributions for a harmonious existence. At FAI we try to replicate this aspect of nature by forming diverse groups of visitors in terms of age, profession and origin, all convened around common ground: the regeneration of ecosystems.

Network of ties

In each encounter we weave a network of ties through conversation. This network expands the possibilities for collaboration on future projects that may contribute to nature-based education, research, the conservation of ecosystems and to integrate the multiplicity of perspectives when it comes to realizing regenerative efforts.



Open agenda

Our conversations arise organically from everyday occurrences. As in nature, there is no one time or fixed place where these exchanges are generated; they occur during daily activities: during lunch, working in the garden, on walks through the plantations and evenings together.
